Call for Applications: Campus Outreach Coordinator (Work Study Contract)

The Quebec Public Interest Research Group (QPIRG) at McGill is a non-profit, student-run organization that conducts research, education, and action on environmental and social justice issues at McGill University and in the Montreal community. The broad mandate of QPIRG McGill is to help McGill students link up with the broader Montreal community through social and environmental justice organizing; since 1988, we've served to bridge the gap between the frequently isolated McGill community and the rest of the city, through the social and environmental issues that affect all of us.

Program Description

QPIRG-McGill is hiring one (1) part-time Campus Outreach Coordinator through McGill's Work Study program. **ONLY** students eligible for the program are able to apply to this position (eligibility requirements can be found here).

Duties and Responsibilities

- Work with the Outreach and Promotions Coordinator to coordinate outreach on social media
- Attend regular staff meetings, and sit on the Popular Education and Outreach Committees
- Distribute flyers and poster McGill buildings for QPIRG events/projects including
 Culture Shock, Spring into Action, the Community University Research Exchange,
 the Alternative Resource Library, etc.
- Help table at QPIRG-McGill outreach and orientation events, including Activities
 Night, tabling at the Y intersection, etc.
- Make classroom announcements regarding QPIRG-McGill projects and campaigns
- Liaise with other campus and community groups regarding QPIRG-McGill activities
- Liaise with other QPIRG staff and board members regarding QPIRG-McGill events and campaigns
- Attend Popular Education Committee meetings and assist QPIRG staff and volunteers with planning two annual event series

A successful candidate will possess the following:

- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Knowledge of McGill campus, especially with regards to outreach (postering locations, postering regulations, etc.)
- Familiarity with social media, web and/or graphic design norms for community organizations
- Comfort speaking in public, making classroom announcements, flyering
- Commitment to the principles of QPIRG McGill's mandate and its realization
- Anti-oppression analysis and proficiency in applying this to all levels of decision-making
- Knowledge and awareness of political, social, economic and environmental issues
- Experience in community organizing, activism and mobilization

- Knowledge of QPIRG-McGill and its programs and working groups an asset
- Spoken and written French an asset
- Ability to take initiative and work independently without much supervision
